

Course Syllabus

Spanish I: Modern Spanish Literature 7.5 Credits*, First Cycle

Learning Outcomes

The course aims to develop students' knowledge and understanding of modern Spanish literature and their ability to relate literary works to a historical and cultural context.

On completion of the course, students will be able to:

- read and interpret the content of texts from different Spanish-speaking countries
- analyse literary texts using literary concepts
- argue for their own interpretations of literary works in a correct, clear and cohesive way, both orally and in writing
- demonstrate an understanding of Spanish literary expressions by, both orally and in writing, placing the literary text into a larger historical and socio-cultural context.

Course Content

The course includes the study of modern literature from the Spanish-speaking world and covers Spanish and Spanish-American literary expressions from the 20th and 21st centuries. A selection of texts from various genres are covered using basic literary concepts. The works are put in relation to their historical, cultural and sociopolitical contexts.

Assessment

- Active participation in seminars
- Written assignments

Obligatory seminars. The language of instruction is Spanish.
